Selected Highlight of Achievements

- Members of Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC are licensed to practice law in the District of Columbia, Maryland, New York, New Jersey, Missouri, Indiana, Kentucky and Wyoming as well as in numerous Federal courts including the Supreme Court.
- Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC was named the 2016 Trial Lawyers of the Year by Public Justice.
- Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC has experience representing individuals and groups seeking sanctions relief.
- Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC represents American victims of terrorism in numerous previously filed or pending actions against state-sponsors of terrorism such as Libya, Syria, the Islamic Republic of Iran, as well as against banks which are accused of funding and supporting terrorism. Those cases include, but are not limited to:
 - Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC served as lead co-counsel in the matter of *Litle et al v Arab Bank, Plc* litigation brought by American victims and their family members who were killed or injured as a result of terror attacks during the Second Intifada. In September 2014, a jury found the Arab Bank guilty of funding and sponsoring terrorism in violation of the US Anti-Terrorism Act (“ATA”). This is the first time a financial institution has been found liable for violating the ATA. The case eventually settled for a confidential amount.
 - Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC sued Libya and Gaddafi in US District Court, gathered powerful evidence against Libya and Gaddafi and led certain negotiations in the \$1.5 billion settlement for American victims of Libyan terror.
 - Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC has sued the Islamic Republic of Iran on behalf of Marines killed or injured in the 1983 Marine Barracks bombing in Beirut, Lebanon and their families. Richard D. Heideman personally argued the punitive damages portion of the case wherein then Chief Judge Royce Lamberth of the United States District Court for the District of Columbia awarded a record-setting one billion

dollars (\$1,000,000,000.00) in punitive damages against Iran for their sponsorship of terrorism.

- On behalf of its clients that have judgments against the Islamic Republic of Iran, Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC is involved in collection activities that have resulted in a US District Court judge ordering the turnover of approximately \$1.9 billion dollars and the forfeiture of a building located in Manhattan. The US Supreme Court affirmed the turnover decision to the American victims of terror. Those funds have now been distributed to those victims of terror, including clients of Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC.
- Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC has obtained judgments in US District Courts on behalf of several victims arising out of the Intifada and Second Intifada aggregating judgments of approximately \$173 Million.
- Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC has been awarded judgments on behalf of American victims of Syrian terror in numerous cases. The U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia has awarded Judgments of \$601 million dollars and over \$3 billion dollars against Syria arising from Syria's sponsorship of the Abu Nidal Organization, a Foreign Terror Organization. A D.C. federal court entered a judgment of \$347.6 million dollar judgment against Syria for its sponsorship of a 2005 terrorist attack at the Amman, Jordan Raddison SAS hotel by the ISIS predecessor, Al-Qaida in Iraq (AQI) that killed two American citizens.
- Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC is involved in a number of ongoing attachments involving funds under sanctions or are otherwise frozen by the US or other governments.
- Heideman Nudelman & Kalik, PC served as lead counsel for Partner Communications Company Ltd. (NASDAQ and TASE: PTNR), a leading Israeli communications company, in the negotiation and drafting of an agreement with Orange (ORAN.PA), a leading French Telecommunications operator, which created a new framework for their relationship following comments by the President of Orange about doing business in the State of Israel.
- Heideman Nudelman & Kalik filed with the International Court of Justice, sitting at The Hague, a legal brief arguing in support of Israel's right to defend her citizens against acts of terrorism.
- Richard D. Heideman was honored as the Distinguished Alumnus of George Washington University; served as Chair of the Herzliya Conference International Advisory Board for

five years; as Chairman of the Hebrew University Faculty of Law Institute for Law and Policy, Jerusalem, Israel for three years; and Chair of the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum Lawyers Committee in Washington, DC for five years. He previously received the Racial Harmony Award from the Foundation for Ethnic Understanding.
